

House Democrats will meet Tuesday afternoon to discuss potential repercussions for a member who has diverted from the caucus to support school voucher legislation.

Rep. John DeBerry, D-Memphis, has faced criticism from some in the House Democratic Caucus over his vote on the education committee last week in support of <u>Gov. Bill Lee's education savings account bill</u>.

The legislation would set aside \$75 million over the next three years to launch ESAs and is expected to cost up to \$125 million by 2024.

DeBerry's "yes" vote March 27 followed a caucus meeting the day before in which Democratic leadership attempted to establish a unified position in opposition to the voucher legislation. DeBerry did not discuss the bill at the caucus meeting. The political arm of Planned Parenthood in Tennessee announced an ad campaign Thursday targeting anti-abortion Memphis Democrat Rep. John DeBerry.

DeBerry was one of three Democratic representatives who joined with Republicans in March to approve Tennessee's version of a "fetal heartbeat bill," which bans abortions after detection of a heartbeat at about six weeks. The other Democrats voting for the bill were Rep. John Mark Windle, D-Livingston, and Rep. Joe Towns, D-Memphis.

"During this legislative season, Rep. DeBerry, has made decisions that don't reflect our community," said Francie Hunt, executive director of Tennessee Advocates for Planned Parenthood. "He voted to criminalize abortion, and his constituents need to know about it. He joins the ranks of other extremist legislators in Tennessee and neighboring states that are working to ban abortion without exception."
