


Status of Mayor Strickland's Executive Order

| ✓ | Collaborate with, and participate in the national and state dialogue about best practices in in all areas related to matters of sexual assault; | Progress: SAK TF participates in national discussions and training through Summit for Cities Series, Joyful Heart Foundation, SAKI training, and the SAFER (Sexual Assault Facts, Education, and Response) |

MSNM is meeting with small community groups at their location. MSNM is distributing awareness material to groups and coordinating a media campaign that includes radio and billboard advertisements. |

Negative Serology Project

DNA technology has advanced in recent years, and evidence that screened negative for serology (biological fluids) under the traditional methods in the past deserves re-examination for DNA using these latest techniques.

- 2,625 Kits sent to BODE Labs for DNA examination
- 1,773 Examinations complete
- 121 Reports sent to TBI for potential CODIS upload because of DNA found
- 1 CODIS Match reported

Lawfully Owed DNA Project

- Lawfully Owed DNA is the project of identifying and collecting DNA from the convicted felons whose DNA was required by law to be on file in CODIS, but was never collected.
- Many crimes, in particular crimes with sexual assault kit evidence, are solved when DNA evidence matches to DNA from known offenders in CODIS. By increasing the number of known offender samples, the expected benefit is to solve more of these crimes.
- Tennessee Bureau of Investigation was awarded a SAKI FY2020 \$1 million dollar grant to assist with sexual assault investigations and prosecutions through the collection of Lawfully Owed DNA.
- The Memphis Police Department, Tennessee Bureau of Investigation, Shelby County District Attorney's Office, Tennessee Department of Corrections, Shelby County Sheriff's Office, and Shelby County Criminal Court Clerk's Office have been meeting regularly to improve DNA collection procedures in Shelby County.

Monthly Investigation Results

7224/7312 Investigations have been initiated:

408/335 Investigations remain active: 5%

6816/6977 Investigations are closed: 95%

1193/1227 Individuals were identified that had been previously convicted of the crime: 18%

698/707 Requests for indictments have been completed against persons or DNA profiles: 10%

- 303/304 named suspects (51 multi case suspects) 43% of indictments
- 395/403 John Does (2 suspects on one case) 57% of indictments
