


City of Memphis/Downtown: Trend 2019-2024

More People = Less Crime Less Blight = Less Crime

- "Eyes on the Street" effect. High foot traffic can also deter crime by creating a sense of visibility and making it harder for criminals to operate without being noticed by potential witnesses.
- Violent crime and property crime drop in areas where blight is remediated. Blight and disinvestment often signal that no one is watching; we will continue our beautification and anti-blight work to further the reduction of negative behavior.





Smart City Plan Recommendations (2021): Technology: Crime Tracking and Prevention



Install multi-functional cameras with fiber connection. Where possible, use cameras that can be accessed by and provide benefit to multiple agencies.



Explore the use of artificial intelligence for video.



Develop clear policy guidance on how video will be used while protecting individual privacy and 1st Amendment rights.



Increase staffing capacity to meet technology needs



Gather input on **camera and monitoring programs** and conduct review on resource efficiency.



Examine cost-effectiveness of various **camera programs** (red light, SkyCop)



Convert all existing streetlights to LED.



Coordinate response activities with other city divisions with law or code enforcement targeted areas

Smart City Plan Recommendations (2021): In Progress: Equitable Digital Access

This initiative (a public-private partnership) will transform the least connected to a national model of future readiness and inclusive connectivity





Fiber infrastructure is the backbone for all Smart City projects:

- Supports real-time AI camera footage transmission
- Enhances internet connectivity and citywide services
- 116 Anchor Locations at City facilities
- 10,000 Fiber Outlets across the City of Memphis for Smart City Related Projects

This infrastructure advancement allows us to tap directly into fiber, increasing speed and reliability of network.



Downtown Command Center: Location Overview

- 2500 sq. ft. BUILDOUT at 250 Peabody Place, Memphis, TN.
- 3 FTE Camera Monitors (9 total FTE's per day) 24-hours a day, 7 days a week. (Police Recruits as pipeline for hiring)
- 4 monitoring stations, restroom, conference room, situation room, front information desk, storage & equipment area.
- Serves as Downtown Command Center for Special Events accommodates key security POCs and other stakeholders.
- Staffing includes one MPD Police Liaison assigned for each shift – real time coordination and response to downtown specific issues.




MPD Staffing Deployment Enhancements

TO THE POLICE OF THE POLICE OF

Creation of *Special Event Section* to manage all Downtown special events

- Activate a new command structure with dedicated Special Event Commander to oversee deployment
 of permanent police resources.
- Increase staffing to Downtown by 24 (total 54) by 11/30/2024, for all events, games, races, festivals etc.
- Assign motorcycle units to support ingress & egress of motorist/pedestrians and facilitate enhanced traffic plan.
- Expand MPD directed patrol footprint to one mile radius for foot patrol officers, bicycles, and mounted patrol.
- Implement mandatory drop-ins by on duty commanders to businesses throughout downtown, to include north and south ends of Main Street, government facilities and downtown perimeter.
- Implement gun detection canines assigned to downtown corridors during most populated times. This initiative will serve as a deterrent to guns entering the 'no-firearms' areas of downtown.
- Continue modified more effective traffic plan to quickly assist motorist in ingress/egress before and after events.
 - Utilize electronic signage to inform special event attendees of most expedient routes in and out of downtown
 - Publicize traffic plan to citizens via, media streams, DMC, and FedEx marketing capabilities.
 - Ensure Coordination with FedEx Staff for fluid traffic operations before and after events.



economic development throughout the district.


